Alternative Text Format Agreement

Effective August 15, 2004, New York State Education Law Article 15B (Section 715, also referred to as Chapter 219) provides a direct role for publishers in the provision of alternate format textbooks and supplemental material to students with disabilities.

By signing this document, and in consideration of the provision of audio, electronic, large print, or Braille textbooks or other course materials, I acknowledge and agree to the following:

- I confirm that I am enrolled for the semester and the particular course(s) for which I am requesting alternatively formatted instructional materials.
- I understand that I must purchase instructional materials at the same cost as other students.
- I will not copy or reproduce alternatively formatted instructional materials nor allow anyone else to do so pursuant to the requirements of the copyright revision act of 1976 as amended (17 U.S.C. §101 et seq.).
- I will not share alternatively formatted materials with any other party.
- I understand that any violation of this agreement may be considered a violation of Hunter's Student Code of Conduct, and may result in penalties (including suspension and expulsion.) Violations may also constitute a violation of federal and/or state laws and may result in civil or criminal prosecution, payment of fines or other monies to the copyright holder, and/or incarceration.
- I have provided the Office of AccessABILITY with appropriate documentation of the disability that prevents me from using standard instructional material. I understand that this documentation will be kept on file at the College.
