B. PURPOSE:

Borough of Manhattan Community College-CUNY (hereafter referred to as BMCC) and Hunter College-CUNY (hereafter referred to as Hunter) agree to articulate the option outlined in this document to ensure a smooth transfer process for Borough of Manhattan Community College graduates.

The purpose of this Articulation Agreement (the "Agreement") is to establish collaboration between Borough of Manhattan Community College and Hunter College, to promote degree completion and facilitate the transfer process.

C. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR SENIOR COLLEGE PROGRAM:

Applicants successfully completing an associate's degree in Gender and Women's Studies at BMCC will be guaranteed transfer admission in the bachelor's degree program in Women and Gender Studies at Hunter and will transfer with junior standing based on the following conditions:

- A GPA equal to or higher than the current GPA required for general transfer students to Hunter College:
- Successful completion of a 3-credit college-level English Course;
- Grade of C or better in all Liberal Arts/Women, Gender and Sexuality Studies course(s);
- Successful completion of a 3- credit college-level mathematics course.

Total transfer credits granted toward the baccalaureate degree: 60

Total additional credits required at the senior college to complete baccalaureate degree: 60

Total credits required to complete the baccalaureate degree: 120

E. COURSE EQUIVALENCIES:

The following GWS courses are equivalent to the specified Women and Gender Studies (WGS) courses. The major requirements or concentrations to which they can be applied are noted in the chart. A maximum of 12 credits can transfer toward the WGS BA requirements. BMCC credits that do not count for requirements in the Hunter WGS major can count as elective credit toward the degree or credit toward a minor or another major (based on degree requirements in other programs at Hunter).

A total of 9 credits is required. Choose 3 courses from AFN 128, AFN 129, ANT 210, COM 245, COM 255, ECO 230, ENG 346, ENG 353, HED 225, HIS 225, POL 120, PSY 245, SPN 400 or THE 305.

SOC 210 has a pre-requisite of SOC 100.

GWS 100 and 2 GWS electives must be passed before taking GWS 300.

AST 109 & AST 108, CHE 109 & CHE 108, or PHY 109 & PHY 108 are alternate course options.

A total of 9 credits is required. Some credits may be satisfied by taking STEM variants in the common core. NOTE: A maximum of 6 elective credits may be taken in career departments.
