



## ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

AGREEMENT made on February 20 of 2020 by and between Hunter College/CUNY (hereinafter, “Hunter”), located at 695 Park Avenue, New York, NY 10021 and Borough of Manhattan Community College (hereinafter “BMCC”), located at 199 Chambers Street, New York, NY 10007, pursuant to which the parties agree to cooperate in providing a comprehensive admission, transfer credit and scholarship agreement as follows.

### A. SENDING AND RECEIVING INSTITUTIONS

*Sending College:* Borough of Manhattan Community College  
*Program:* Liberal Arts  
*Degree:* Associate of Arts (A.A.)

*Receiving College:* Hunter College  
*Department:* Department of Classical and Oriental Studies  
*Program:* Chinese Language and Literature  
*Degree:* Bachelor of Arts (B.A.)

### B. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR SENIOR COLLEGE

BMCC students with a completed A.A. degree will be admitted to Hunter if the following additional requirements are met:

- A Grade Point Average (GPA) equal to or better than the current GPA required for General Transfer students to Hunter College.
- Grade of D or better in freshman composition, its equivalent, or a higher-level English course.
- Successful completion of a 3-credit college-level math course.
- Completion of a Chinese language placement exam at Hunter College.
- Completion of CHIN 21000 at BMCC with the grade of B or higher.

Total transfer credits granted toward the baccalaureate degree: 60

Total additional credits required at the senior college to complete baccalaureate degree: 60

Total credits required to complete the baccalaureate degree: 120

### C. TRANSFER CREDITS AWARDED

BMCC graduates who complete the Associate in Arts (A.A.) degree in Liberal Arts will receive 60 credits toward the Bachelor of Arts (B.A) degree in Chinese Language and Literature at Hunter. Please note that the following courses taken at BMCC will transfer as Liberal Arts Elective credits and will not count toward the 30 credits required for the Chinese Language and Literature major at Hunter: CHIN 10100, CHIN 10500, CHIN 10200, CHIN 10600, and CHIN 20000. Upon acceptance at Hunter, students will be granted three Hunter credits for each of CHIN 20100 and CHIN 20200.

<b>Modern Language<sup>4</sup></b> - Students are required to take two semesters of the same Modern Foreign Language. One semester can be taken in the Common Core.	3

<b>Liberal Arts Electives<sup>7</sup>:</b> Liberal Arts electives are courses in Art, English, Ethnic Studies, Health Education, Mathematics, Modern Languages, Music, Speech, Science, and Social Science. ITL 170 is a Liberal Arts elective. A maximum of 6 credit that are taken in career departments may count as electives in the Liberal Arts program (e.g. ACC, ADV, BUS, CCC, CED, CIS, CSC, ECE, EDB, EDU, EMC, FNB, HIT, HUM, MAR, MMP, NUR, OFF, RET, RLS, RTT, SBE, SLS, TTA, VAT).

1. Consult with an advisor on which courses to take to satisfy these areas.

2. These areas can be satisfied by taking a STEM variant.
3. No more than two courses in any discipline or interdisciplinary field can be used to satisfy Flexible Common Core requirements.
4. Students are required to take two semesters of the same Modern Language. One semester of the language can be taken in the World Cultures and Global Issues area in the Common Core. Students are advised to take Chinese courses to satisfy these requirements.
5. Choose from any English (ENG) 300-level course, or any ASN, AFL, LAT 300-level literature course.
6. Choose two from anthropology, economics, geography, history, philosophy, political science, psychology or sociology. Two different disciplines must be taken and cannot be from the same disciplines as satisfied in the Common Core.
7. Students are advised to take at least 6 credits of Chinese. No more than 6 credits can be taken from the following career areas: accounting (ACC), allied health sciences (EMT, HIT, and RTT), business (BUS, FNB, SBE, TTA), computer information systems (CIS), health education (HED), human services (HUM), media arts and technology (ANI, MMA, MMP, VAT), nursing (NUR), and teacher education (ECE, EDB, EDU). Please be advised that some exceptions may apply. Please speak to your advisor for more details.

**F. ARTICULATION AGREEMENT FOLLOW-UP PROCEDURES**

1. *Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying or terminating agreement:*  
When either of the degree programs involved in this agreement undergoes a change, the agreement will be reviewed and revised accordingly by representatives from each institution's respective departments, selected by their chairpersons/program directors.
2. *Procedures for evaluating agreement, i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:*  
Each semester Hunter College will provide BMCC the following information: a) the number of BMCC students who applied to the program; b) the number of BMCC students who were accepted into the program; c) the number of BMCC students who enrolled; and d) the aggregate GPA of these enrolled students.
3. *Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, Websites, etc.:*  
This articulation agreement will be publicized on the BMCC website, and on the Hunter College website. Transfer advisors at BMCC will promote this agreement with eligible students.

**G. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS.**

a. Reservation of Rights: The parties acknowledge that The Board of Trustees of the City University of New York reserves the right to make changes of any nature in the academic programs and requirements of The City University of New York and its constituent colleges, including Hunter College. All programs, requirements, and courses are subject to termination or change without advance notice.

Other than as provided in this Articulation Agreement, applicants for admission and students admitted pursuant to this agreement shall be subject to Hunter College's admissions and academic policies and regulations then in effect.

b. No Assignment. Neither party may assign its obligations pursuant to this Agreement, in whole or part, without the other party's prior written consent.

c. Entire Agreement. This Agreement embodies the entire agreement and understanding between the parties and supersedes all prior agreements, whether oral or written between the parties relating to the subject matter hereof.

d. Governing Law. This contract shall be construed in accordance with, and its performance governed by, the laws of the State of New York.

e. Modifications. Except as may be otherwise provided herein, this agreement may not be amended or modified except by a written instrument executed by both parties.


f. Term and Termination. This agreement shall take effect beginning with the Fall 2020 semester at Hunter College. The terms of this agreement shall remain in effect until terminated by either party. Either party may at any time terminate this agreement, in whole or in part, upon thirty days' notice to the other. In the event this agreement is terminated, the provisions specified in the Transfer Guide and Course Equivalencies shall continue in effect with respect to any students who have been accepted for admission as of the date termination, subject to the provisions of paragraph 6a of this Agreement.


