B. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR SENIOR COLLEGE PROGRAM

A completed A.S. degree in Early Childhood Education at BMCC, with the following additional requirements:

- Grade of B or better in English Composition I, its equivalent, or any course designated as writing intensive
- Successful completion of a three-credit college-level mathematics course
- For direct admission into Hunter College's School of Education, students must have a cumulative GPA of 3.300 or better from the entire college/postsecondary school academic history
- Applicants must participate in a group interview at Hunter College and provide an on-site writing sample
- Accepted students must declare both a major in the School of Arts & Sciences and a major in the School of Education

 When either of the degree programs involved in this agreement undergoes a change, the agreement will be reviewed and revised accordingly by faculty from each institution's respective departments, selected by their chairpersons and/or program directors.
- 2. Procedures for evaluating agreement, i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:

 Each semester Hunter College will provide BMCC with the following information: a) the number of BMCC students who applied to the program; b) the number of BMCC students who were accepted into the program; c) the number of BMCC students who enrolled; and d) the aggregate GPA of these enrolled students.
- 3. Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, Websites, etc.:

 This articulation agreement will be publicized on the BMCC website and on Hunter College's website. Transfer advisors at BMCC will promote this agreement with eligible students.
