B. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR SENIOR COLLEGE PROGRAM

A completed A.A. degree in Secondary Social Studies Education at BMCC, with the following additional requirements :

- Grade of B or better in freshman composition, its equivalent, or a higher-level English course;
- Successful completion of a 3 credit college-level mathematics course;
- For direct admission into Hunter College's School of Education, students must have a cumulative GPA of 3.300 or better from the entire college/postsecondary school academic history;
- Applicants must participate in a group interview at Hunter College and provide an on-site writing sample;
- Accepted students must declare a major in History.

Total transfer credits granted toward the baccalaureate degree: 60

Total additional credits required at the senior college to complete baccalaureate degree: 60

Total credits required to complete the baccalaureate degree: 120

C. TRANSFER CREDIT AWARDED

Borough of Manhattan Community College graduates who complete the Associate in Arts (A.A.) degree in Secondary Social Studies Education will receive 60 credits toward the Bachelor of Arts (B.A) degree in History/Adolescent Social Studies Education at Hunter College.

When either of the degree programs involved in this agreement undergoes a change, the agreement will be reviewed and revised accordingly by faculty from each institution's respective departments, selected by their chairpersons and/or program directors.

2. *Procedures for evaluating agreement, i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:*


Each semester Hunter College will provide Borough of Manhattan Community College the following information: a) the number of BMCC students who applied to the program; b) the number of BMCC students who were accepted into the program; c) and the number of BMCC students who enrolled; and d) the aggregate GPA of these enrolled students.

3. *Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisors, websites, etc.:*

This articulation agreement will be publicizing on Borough of Manhattan Community College's website and on Hunter College's website. Transfer advisors at BMCC will promote this agreement with eligible students.




