
How to add courses to the Shopping Cart and using 'Validate Shopping Cart' in Schedule Builder

Validating a shopping cart allows students to check for potential issues with their class selections before their enrollment appointment starts and finalizing their enrollment. This includes identifying time conflicts, missing prerequisites, class permissions needed, essentially giving them a heads-up to resolve any problems before attempting to register for classes. Students can identify and address potential issues with their course selections early on, preventing last-minute enrollment complications, adjustments, or overrides. For example, the shopping cart opens for Fall 2025 on April 7th and registration starts April 21st. This feature gives students 14 days to get their enrollment correct to avoid any last minute issues the day their enrollment appointment begins.





Click on Schedule Builder



Scroll down to the Term you would like to review your schedule




STEP 4

Type in the course you would like to add to your shopping cart






Click on GET THIS SCHEDULE once you have selected all your interested courses



In the Action column on this page, click the dropdown and choose 'Add to Cart' for all courses to add them to your shopping cart






STEP 11

Click on Do Actions to officially add the courses to the shopping cart




STEP 12

After adding all the courses the shopping cart and receiving the message you see in the screenshot below, you can click 'Return to Select Courses'.

Once you get back to the select courses page, you will see that the Validate Shopping Cart is now available to select.



You can see in the screenshot that the selected courses have enrollment errors. This gives students the knowledge of what will happen if they were to try to enroll before their enrollment appointment begins and what issues they will need to address before being able to enroll.
