

Math Placement for Freshmen

Having the right math placement on record is necessary so that you can register for the proper classes.

You can view your Math Placement Milestone in your Student Center on [CUNYfirst](#) under Milestones. Your milestone will determine the course in which you are able to enroll. The appropriate math course selection for your intended major will be discussed during your learning community registration session at orientation. The Math Placement Milestones are as follows:

Math Milestones at Hunter College

Math Milestone Attained	Permission to Take
NONE	Math 100, Math 102
101EN	Online Immersion Workshop to Place in Math Milestone 10100
10100	Math 101
LEVEL1	Math 10150, Math 104, Stat 113, Math 124, Math 125, Math 12550
LEVEL2	Includes all courses at LEVEL 1 Plus: Math 140, Math 150, Math 152, Math 160, Stat 212, Stat 213

MATH 100, 101, and 102 do not fulfill the calculus requirement for accounting, economics, math, pre-med, or science-related majors. Students intending to pursue these majors and whose milestone is not level 1 or 2 should take the Hunter College Math Placement Test (MPT) to place higher.

If you are taking a college course or AP exam in Math but will not have the grade/scores until June, please make sure to have the official score report/college transcript sent to Hunter as soon as possible.

Disagree with your Math Milestone Placement?

- You may take the Hunter College Math Placement Test (MPT). We encourage you to enroll for an [immersion workshop](#) to prepare for the MPT, on your own. You can gauge your level of math mastery by taking the three levels of diagnostic quizzes on the test prep website. You must sign into Blackboard before clicking this [link](#) prior to taking the test.

- If you are still not satisfied with your Math Placement Milestone after taking the exam, you can [submit an appeal](#) along with supporting documentation including an unofficial copy of your high school transcript that shows your math grades and Regents scores (if any), unofficial copies of any college math courses you have taken, AP scores and or anything else you deem relevant.

- Students who've placed into Math 101 may also consider taking Math 101 over the summer or earning credit [via CLEP examination](#).
- You are exempt from having to take the MPT if you've earned a score of 4 or 5 on AP Calculus AB or Calculus BC.
